

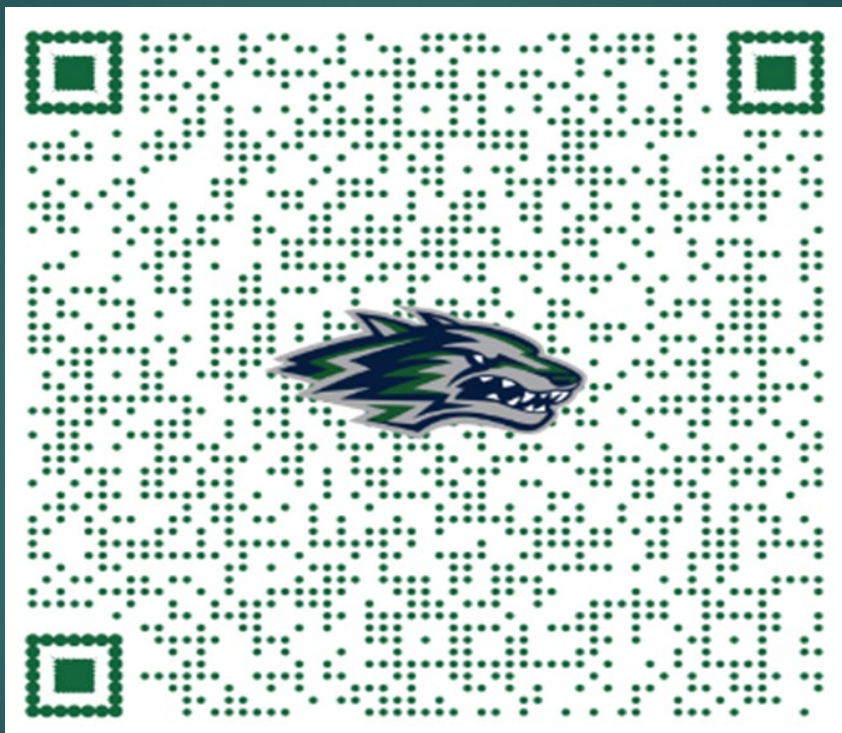

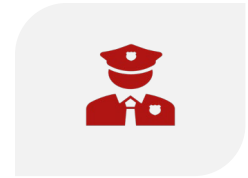

Athletics Information

Academic Eligibility

All students must maintain a minimum of 2.0 GPA. Any student that falls below a 2.0 for two consecutive grading periods will be deemed “Academically Ineligible” for participation in that sport season.

- IMPORTANT INFORMATION:**
- Students will not be registered without parent contact information and signature on the front of this form.
 - Schedules will be released on Parent and Student Connect ONLY.
 - 7th Grade Student Orientation/Campus Tour will be held the week before school starts.
 - Class leveling takes place within the first 2 weeks of school. In an effort to provide the best learning environment for all students, class schedules may be changed to lower class sizes and/or meet students' learning needs.
 - Your child has an academic counselor who will follow them through 8th grade. Counselors are available to assist students in all aspects of school. If you have questions, feel free to call, or email, your child's counselor or the Main Office.
 - Lunch / 0 period PE – Students enrolling in year-long elective courses or students enrolling in a second year-long elective have priority.

INSTRUMENTAL & VOCAL MUSIC: See Mrs. G... regarding instrument... Cross for vocal music.

Concert Band: This class has no prerequisites and is designed for students interested in playing a brass or woodwind instrument. Students must be able to read music and play a string instrument.

Orchestra: This class has no prerequisites and is designed for students interested in playing a string instrument.

Percussion: This class is for all 7th grade students interested in playing a percussion instrument. Some outside of school rehearsal is required.

Color Guard: Open to all students interested in playing a color guard instrument. Some outside of school rehearsal is required.

Soprano/Alto Choir: Gifts only. This class is for students interested in singing and intermediate level singers and has no prerequisites.

Tenors/Bass Choir: Boys only. This class is for students interested in singing and intermediate level singers and has no prerequisites.

Chamber Choir: AUDITION REQUIRED – Gifted students interested in advanced group singing. Students must be able to handle the line commitment.

Concert Choir: AUDITION or SOPRANO/ALTO/ TENOR/BASS CHOIR. This is an advanced group singing course. Students must be able to handle the line commitment.

Jazz Choir (Show Choir): AUDITION REQUIRED – Gifted students interested in performing jazz and popular music. Students must be able to handle the line commitment.

SEMESTER ELECTIVES: *COMPLETED APPLICATION REQUIRED WITH THIS REGISTRATION FORM*****

Advanced Study Skills: Teaches skills to prepare for high school. This course is open to students on grades from their 6th grade year and above. This course is taken in conjunction with the 7th grade course. This course is offered to 7th and 8th grade students. This course is designed to provide additional instruction and focus in the math curriculum. Students are generally self-motivated and are able to work independently. Placement also based on teacher and/or Learning Director recommendation.

APPLIED – AVID: is an elective class for students who would like to prepare for four-year universities. Requirements are satisfactory citizenship.

Drama: This course is designed for the general student who desires to help others who have special needs through beginning drama. Mentors will act on one-on-one basis with students and develop leadership and acting skills and will assist partner with projects.

Latino Development: An introduction to Mexican history and Latin American myths.

Journalism: This course is designed to teach students the production and development of a student newspaper.

Peer Counseling: APPLIED – Peer counseling is designed to help students develop counseling skills that enhance the positive attitudes towards self and provide techniques that can be used to help others.

Student Leadership: This course is designed to help students develop leadership skills and emphasize the value of school spirit and a positive school culture. The course will focus on organizing school events that result in an increase of student connection with the campus.

Service Learning: This course is designed to create and participate in community outreach activities by providing leadership opportunities for students.

Video Production: This course is designed to help students who are interested in video production. Students will design, film and edit their own videos using state of the art computer technology. These videos will be used to help promote the school's social media presence on YouTube, Instagram, and other social media sites, etc. Students will create video announcements as members of our WorkPac Film Crew and special edition videos for school activities.

APPLICATION REQUIRED: - This course is open to students who are interested in producing on the school yearbook.

Drama: Open to all 7th grade. For students who have previously been in a play or have taken a Drama class.

Forensics: - Forensics is a competitive speech and debate team. Students will learn how to construct and defend an argument as well as the fundamentals of public speaking and performance.

Writers: This course allows students to explore writing in varied genres: short stories, poetry, plays, as well as develop a writing portfolio. Students will also read literature, as well as analyze author's style and use of literary elements.

Science Discoveries: Introductory Computer Science course that empowers students to create authentic artifacts and engage w/ computer science as a medium for communication, problem solving, and fun. This course takes a wide lens on computer science.

Dance: - This is an elective within the Physical Education & Performing Arts Department. It is designed to develop basic technique, confidence in expression, and build an appreciation for a wide variety of dance forms (jazz, modern, ballet, etc.). This class does not take the place of a regular PE class.

SEMESTER ELECTIVES: *OFFERED IN PAIRS-SEE CHOICES ON FRONT OF THIS FORM*****

Agriculture Exploration: This course is offered for students interested in the agricultural science courses in high school. Topics include, plant science, animal science, public speaking, record keeping, agricultural jobs and organizations, judging and competitions.

Art: This course teaches the basics of drawing, painting and ceramics, as well as the elements of art and art history. All abilities are welcome.

Engineering Drama: This course is designed to develop goals and confidence in expression and to build appreciation for all forms of drama.

Exploring Technology: Students will cover many aspects of technology through hands on project based learning. Student will have the opportunity to build, program, and operate ROBOTS through advanced technology.

Exploratory Agriculture Mechanics & Engineering: This course provides an introduction to the agriculture mechanics and engineering industry. Students will acquire basic skills needed in the workplace.

Introduction to Spanish: Students will learn the basic conversational skills in Spanish as well as the culture of Spanish-speaking countries.

Ceramics: Ceramics is an introductory art course focusing on the basic techniques of ceramics making. Students will learn the concepts of aesthetics, craftsmanship, development of skills and creative problem solving.

Teen Living: Home economics for the 21st century. Hands-on semester course including nutrition, food prep, self-esteem development, and money management.

Keyboarding: For students who desire keyboarding skills that will enable them to use a computer efficiently. Students will master the touch method of keying the alphabetic and number keys and the numeric keypad. Students will have some exposure to basic computer applications and skills.

Important Registration Info

Parent/guardian signature is **required** on the registration form.

- ▶ Elective application forms are due the day before counselors return to campus.
- ▶ If the registration form and/or applications are not turned in when counselors return, then it's up to the parent/guardian to drop them off at Reyburn Main Office.

Math

- ▶ **Advanced Math 7** – A class for the student who consistently scores at the highest testing level on standardized/benchmark math tests. Placement in this class is based on iReady and test scores, and teacher recommendation is required.
- ▶ **Math 7** – All other students who did not fit into the two previous categories.

***The biggest shift for students from 6th-7th grade is the weighting of grades. Generally, 30% of the grade is based on homework/classwork & 70% is tests and quizzes. ***

Physical Education/Gym Class

- ◆ PE uniform required – ordered through Reyburn PE teacher at beginning of the year.
- ◆ Students must obtain a lock for PE Locker. One can be borrowed from the school.
- ◆ Unified PE is a class where general education students help special education students participate in PE.

Organization:
